six guests comfortably.

OON AFTER THEY BUILT THEIR DREAM GETAWAY HOME upstate New York, a high-powered executive couple—he in the entertainment industry, she in banking— taking up too much precious space. With some helpful

found that both they and their frequent weekend visitors were in need of some privacy. So the homeowners bought the neighboring eight acres with the express goal of adding a guest house for family and friends that would be just a two-minute stroll away on a sloping lake-view site.

The couple offered the father-and-son team of Steve and Marc Dubrovsky of Woodstone Development Corp. the challenge of designing and building a cottage that, despite its scant 900 square feet of living space, evokes the warmth and grandeur of an early-20thcentury mountain lodge. The







